Dear parents and carers,

We are very impressed with the effort that the children have been putting into their home learning. We would like to celebrate this by showcasing some of the brilliant pieces of home learning we have received below. Well done and keep up the fantastic work!

Broadening provision

Last week we welcomed Year R children back into school, along with additional children of key workers. Interestingly, prior to the recent change in government advice to schools, we had been operating a rotation of staff to cover care for children of key workers. The current advice, as schools open to other year groups is to have 'bubble groups' with consistent adults attached and not on rotation. So, this is the model we have now adopted in line with government advice and we will evaluate how that goes. It has been challenging to make plans only to have conflicting guidance and then have to adapt.

We hope to be able to open to Year 1 pupils next in June and more information will follow to parents soon with dates and timings.

Online and remote learning

The school actively sought parents' views in a recent survey and it was a really beneficial way to actively capture your thoughts, concerns and questions. We had more responses than ever and it is clear that there is a wide range of opinion on schools opening to more pupils.

It is no surprise that some parents would like the possibility of online lessons with the class teacher. Obviously, this may prove to be more challenging as some staff are also physically in school with other children for whom they are now planning and teaching.

As I have mentioned in my previous newsletters, we will soon be moving over to Google Classroom and have been working tirelessly in the background to push this. We have set up a school login and passwords for pupils and staff members which will avoid the use of staff/parents' personal accounts. More details will follow shortly and pupils will need to login in on a suitable device. We hope to roll this out for pupils initially in Years 2 to 6. So do look out for an email with your child's login and password shortly. We also have the facility to integrate Google Meets into the Classroom feature. It is important that any platform we use is sustainable and a safe long-term solution. We will also strive to provide home learning activities on our website during this term.
