Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to you all as the rapid events of last week meant for a rather sudden end to school.

Your kind messages have enabled us all to continue to be resilient and given us enormous strength in these challenging times. I hope that you and your families are all safe, well and healthy. That is the most important thing of all. Thank you for your understanding. We, like all of you, are having to get used to a new way of doing things.

I want to reiterate how brilliantly the children have behaved throughout this. Last week, they were asking some very thoughtful and mature questions. I am also very proud of all the team at Preston Candover who have been incredibly supportive of our community.

I know that our teachers worked hard to put together remote learning resources in a short space of time and our admin team have worked relentlessly to support. Even in ordinary circumstances, this would be a busy time of year for the Headteacher and Finance Officer. We have been working flat out to put plans in place ensuring the safety of children of critical workers and of staff who continue to work on-site and off-site. We are dedicated to continuing to support you where we can.

The Prime Minister instructed us on Monday evening to stay at home until further notice unless for:

- shopping for basic necessities, as infrequently as possible
- one form of exercise a day for example a run, walk, or cycle alone or with members of your household
- any medical need, to provide care or to help a vulnerable person; and
- travelling to and from work, but only where this is absolutely necessary and cannot be done from home.

The advice is that children should observe the same social distancing principles as adults.

The teachers will continue to be contactable via the school office email and will help with elements of remote learning. All children were reminded of their Purple Mash login on Friday. Families who were absent were emailed these last week. Teachers will explore setting 2Do tasks on Purple Mash whilst pupils are at home. Just a note to pupils; when you have completed an activity on Purple Mash, save the learning. Then go back onto the 2Dos and press the 'hand in' button. This will allow your teachers to see how many children use it and it will allow them to feedback through comments.
