Curriculum Visits

Puffins Trip to Windsor Castle

On Thursday 23rd January Puffins Class visited Windsor Castle to explore the lives of Queen Elizabeth II and Queen Victoria. The children were highly engaged throughout the day and thoroughly enjoyed exploring the many aspects of Monarchy life.



Our first stop was outside St George's Chapel where we watched and listened to the Change of the Guard. We then toured around St George's Chapel to discover where the Knights of the Garter sit alongside their crown and sword. In St George's Hall we explored the thousands of Garter shields decorated on the ceiling and walls. In particular, we searched for and found Lord Boyce's shield. Lord Boyce is a current Knight of the Garter and is also a Grandfather to one of our children. During our learning session in St George's Hall, the children dressed up and reenacted the Queen's Coronation and the dubbing of a knight. On our tour into the Grand Vestibule we discovered some of Queen Victoria's treasures. The children studied Queen Victoria's statue and used their observational drawing skills to draw Queen



Victoria with her favourite dog 'Sharp'.

Following our trip to Windsor
Castle, the children have raised lots of brilliant questions surrounding our History topic. We are currently becoming researchers to answer these

questions. We continued our learning journey about the Monarchy, studying timelines and family trees. Puffins had an exciting 'Right Royal Day' on Thursday 6th February where we continued to dive into the past. We celebrated on the day Queen Elizabeth became Queen.

Robins Trip to Wisley Gardens

On Monday, Robins went on a trip to Wisley. We had so much fun exploring the gardens and examining the different plants. We used the data loggers, thermometers and compasses to check the weather up at the weather station. Our predictions were proved correct when the temperature got colder as we climbed a hill, and the humidity score told us when it was about to rain! In the afternoon, we ventured into the glasshouse. They had an exhibition on where plants were incorporated into everyday household items. We developed our sketching skills, focusing on the detail and the texture of different plants. We had a great day!





Kingsfishers Trip to Ufton Court

On Tuesday 28th January, Kingfisher class experienced an Egyptian day at Ufton Court. When we arrived, we were greeted by an Egyptian, who led us through the amazing grounds into our own private room for the day. We started the day















by looking at a variety of artefacts during an activity called 'call my bluff', this was a fantastic 'hands on' and fun activity to help us learn even more about the Egyptians. The next activity allowed all the children to have a role in mummifying a fake person, all the children found it very interesting as it went through the whole process and we even practised our drama skills when parading the mummy around Ufton court.



The adults definitely found the mummifying on the gruesome side but Kingfisher class have not stopped talking about it and would love to have a school mummifying kit! After lunch, all children became archaeologists in the Ufton court big dig. All children were given a section of the forest where they had to search for different artefacts. This took a lot of teamwork and perseverance, as it was extremely cold but they were all so proud of each other when they found an object. These objects included animal skulls, bones and a variety of pottery. We were all impressed that they nearly re- created a whole pot. Overall, it was a really amazing day, the children and adults had a lot of fun and learnt so much.
