#### **Dear Parents**

This year the whole school has enjoyed a variety of different extra-curricular sporting activities:-

#### **Autumn term**

- The whole school started their Golden Mile challenge and over the year have enjoyed seeing how many miles they can achieve.
- On the 30<sup>th</sup> November Perins hosted a basketball competition which we took two teams of six. The competition followed a new 3v3 format which involved both teams of three working in half a full sized court with both teams shooting towards the same basket. Both of our teams played three games each. Games were two minutes with three players on court followed by another two minutes where the other three players in the team were on court. One of our teams came second in their pool having won one of their games, drawn one and conceded one. Our second team came third in their pool. All of the children demonstrated good sportsmanship and played well as a team. It was a great opportunity for them to put the skills they have learned in their PE sessions into practice and compete in a tournament against other schools in the spirit of friendly competition.

## **Spring Term**

 On Monday 6<sup>th</sup> February eight children from Years 3 to 6 went along to represent our school at an after school cross country event at Perins. There were a total of 174 runners across the three age groups from schools across East Hampshire at this event. Four of our runners finished in the top 10 for their year groups events-Freddie W, Poppy Olivia and Lily. The top 12 boys and top 12 girls from the Year 5 and six races went on to represent East Hampshire at the County Cross Country Final on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> March at Down Grange, Basingstoke and we were really excited that Lily qualified for this.

### Summer term

• On Friday 6<sup>th</sup> June 12 children from Years 3 to 6 came along to represent our school at an after school Quad Kids event at Perins. Five schools came to the event and there were a total of 34 year 3 and 4 children and 30 Year 5 and 6 children from the five schools who took part. The four events consisted of a 75m sprint, 600m run, standing long jump, and howler throw and everyone competed in all events.

In the boys Year 3 and 4 600m, Rafferty, Freddy and Freddie came 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> overall. In the Year 5 and 6 events Joe came 1<sup>st</sup> in the 600m and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the sprint.





















W/C 19<sup>th</sup> June - all classes took part in our in house sports week with five different sporting challenges to earn points for their house point team. The challenges consisted of:-

- A skipping challenge to see how many skips they can do in 30 seconds for KS1 and one minute for KS2.
- A Shuttle Run children see how many shuttle runs they can do in 30 seconds for KS1 and one minute for KS2
- Golden mile challenge How many laps of the Golden Mile track can they do in five minutes for KS1 and 10 minutes for KS2
- Tap up tennis challenge How many times can they bounce a tennis ball on a racket in 30 seconds for KS1 and 1 minute for KS2
- Speed Bounce challenge How many times can they jump over a hurdle in 30 seconds for KS1 and 1 minute for KS2
- Throughout the year all classes have taken part in the virtual games events in their PE sessions with the results being sent off to our school games organiser at the beginning of July. The events consisted of a virtual run, throw and jump competition where children take part in a sprint shuttle run, triple jump and chest push challenge, a multi skills challenge- consisting of agility obstacles, a target throw and balancing competition and a skipping challenge to see how many skips can be done in a set time.
- On 5<sup>th</sup> July 6 children from Years 3 to 6 represented our school at an unforgettable area sports event at Perins. Despite the fact that we only took a small number of children to this event we won the award for "athletic excellence for the school with the highest proportion of top 3 placings per competitor " All the children came in the top 3 for most of the events they did! The four Year 4's that came Ivy, Olivia, Charlotte and Joe V made up a relay team and came second. All six children ran each distance race for their year group with Joe G coming 1<sup>st</sup> in each. Nikita was 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in his ones and they both made up a relay and came second! Each of the six came in the top three in the field events they did too!



















On Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July Wrens, Kites and Kestrels took part in their sports day - joining together to take part in a sprint, egg and spoon and obstacle race in order to earn points for their house point teams. The afternoon was led by the amazing Year 5 and 6 sport leaders who showed amazing leadership and supported the event fantastically. All of the children really enjoyed the afternoon and earned lots of points for their house point teams.
