
Dear Parents and carers,

### Leader in Me

We are proud to be a "Leader in Me School".

Leader in Me is wholeschool improvement based on the principle that everyone can be a leader. Staff and pupils learn to use a common language and build an understanding of how to work effectively, independently and interdependently, in all aspects of life, not just at school.



This evidence-based approach empowers pupils with the leadership and life skills they need to thrive in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. We focus on developing the whole child by:-

### Sports News Update

Throughout last year, all classes have taken part in the virtual games events in their PE sessions with the results being sent off to our school games organiser at the beginning of July. The events consisted of a virtual run, throw and jump competition, where children take part in a sprint shuttle run, triple jump and chest push challenge, a multi skills challenge - consisting of agility obstacles, a target throw and balancing competition and a skipping challenge to see how many skips can be done in a set time. The events are open to all schools across East Hampshire and the scores for each school are compared to see which schools came  $I^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  in each event. In September we received a lovely set of certificates through for these events.

In the skipping competition our Year I came  $2^{nd}$  overall and the Year 2,  $3^{rd}$  place. In the multi skills event our Year I and Year 2 children both came  $1^{st}$ .

In the run, jump and throw event both our Year I and Year 2 came  $I^{st}$  and in the skipping competition, Year 4 came  $3^{rd}$ .
