Reminders for next term ...

Pencil cases

We find the children take great pride and learn from taking responsibility for their own belongings and it supports them in being prepared. The school provides handwriting writing pens and will always have spare stationery.

Please may we ask that all children in KS2 have a named pencil case, small enough to fit into a tray drawer and on their desk. Some of the pencil cases are very large and children in lower KS2 need enough desk space to position their exercise books and other resources.

The following items would be helpful:

5 to 6 colouring pencils including primary colours. Writing pencil Rubber Pencil sharpener canister Small ruler Glue stick

School Uniform

Our school uniform has been carefully chosen to help children feel part of the school community and give a strong sense of identity. It is important that additional accessories such as jewellery, colourful hair bands, nail varnish/make up are not worn. Watches are allowed as are small studded earrings but the latter should not be worn on PE days. Long hair should be tied back. Wearable tech such as smart watches with recorders or cameras are not allowed.

Please may we ask that **all school uniform is named**, including, bags, outdoor coats and any water bottles that are brought into school.

PE Kit

Please make sure your child has a PE kit with them every day and every item should be named. The weather is cold and a number of children only have PE shorts in their kits. Pupils may wear plain, dark jogging bottoms outside in colder weather.

As the weather is cold now, please make sure your child brings a named coat with them every day.
