





The Earth and everything in it are important to God. God has a unique relationship with human beings as their Creator and Sustainer. Humans should care for the world because it belongs to God. Many Christians feels a sense of belonging when visiting the Church (God's House) and Jewish people may when they visit a synagogue Shabbat is the '7th Day' according to the Jewish | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In many stories, the end of the journey is very important The Christian Nativity story is told in two of the four gospels in the Bible The story tells how Jesus was born in Bethlehem In the story, Mary and Joseph travel to Bethlehem and at the end of the journey, Mary gives birth to Jesus The shepherds also go on a journey to see Jesus and find him at the end of the journey The magi (wise men) go on a journey to see Jesus and find him at the end of their journey Christians believe that Jesus is God and that he was born as a baby in Bethlehem. The Bible points out that his birth showed that he was extraordinary (for example, he is worshipped as a king, in | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Having authority means the right or power to give orders, make decisions, or control people We have various authority figures in our life Some Christians think that Jesus demonstrates authority at various points in the bible Christians believe Jesus brings good news for all people. For Christians, this good news includes being loved by God, and being forgiven for bad things. Christians believe Jesus is a friend to the poor and friendless. Christians believe Jesus' teachings make people think hard about how to live and show them the right way. | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are sad and happy parts to the Easter story Jesus had a meal with his disciples to celebrate the Jewish festival of Passover This is called the Last Supper The disciples were happy to be together but Jesus was sad as he knew one of them would hand him over to the Roman Soldiers Jesus was arrested by the soldiers and he was killed His followers came to the place where he was buried but the stone had been rolled away and his body was not there His followers were happy when Jesus appeared to them some time later Christians believe from this story that Jesus died and rose again. This is called the resurrection and Christians celebrate this at Easter. Easter is very important in the 'big story' of the Bible. | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Seder plate helps Jews remember a special story called the Passover The story of the Passover is found in the Torah, the first five books of the Hebrew scriptures It is remembered at a special festival of Passover each year Passover tells the story of how Jews were led out of Egypt and slavery by Moses The Seder meal has special foods in it to help remember parts of the story: bitter herbs, a lamb bone, celery or parsley, paste made of fruit and nuts and a hard boiled egg | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The bible contains different stories that tell Christians about how to live; it is the Christian special book, The Torah contains the laws that God gave give the Jews; it is the Jewish special book The Torah scrolls are written in Hebrew Script Torah scrolls are kept in the synagogue Simchat Torah celebration or Simhath Torah (also Simkhes Toreh, meaning: "Rejoicing with/of the Torah,") is a celebration marking the end of the year-long cycle of public Torah readings, and the beginning of a new cycle. The Simchat Torah is the only time of year on which the Torah scrolls are taken out of the ark and read at night | |

According to historic sources the Archangel Gabri-el is ruler of the first Heaven and is closest to humankind. Gabri-el appeared to Daniel to tell him of the coming of the Messiah. Within the New Testament it is Gabri-el again who brings the message of the coming Messiah to Mary | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hinduism is over 4,000 years old and made up of lots of different Indian religious traditions. Holi is a two day Hindu festival On the first day people come together around a bonfire and celebrate good overcoming evil The story of Prahlad is told at Holi, who was the son of a demon king. Prahlad worshipped Lord Vishnu instead of his father and was protected by him from being killed by his father Hindus celebrate the festival by having bonfires, telling the story | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A ritual is "a religious or solemn ceremony consisting of a series of actions according to a prescribed order" In Catholicism, the rosary is used as part of a prayer ritual In Christianity, the Lord's Prayer is used as part of a prayer ritual In Judaism, the Mezuzah is used and the Shema is said as part of the prayer ritual In Hinduism, rituals include devotion (Bhakti), or Worship (Puja). Rituals and routines are different from each other Christians see Holy Week as the culmination of Jesus' | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sacred is a form of special; if something is sacred, it deserves much respect and could be described as having been 'touched by God' Hindus believe in one God, Brahman, but the millions of qualities that Brahman has are represented by millions of different gods and goddesses. Going to worship at a shrine is like visiting the gods and goddesses. Worship (<i>pūjā</i>) is one of the most central practices in Hinduism. Every form of worship consists of making offerings and receiving blessings, from elaborate | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Christians believe the world was created by God and everything in it. The stories of creation are found in the Old Testament book of Genesis Christians believe that humans have a responsibility towards all of creation. Christians use the story of 'the fall' to explain why suffering and death have entered the world. Hindus believe the universe was created by Brahma, the creator who made the universe out of himself. After Brahma created the world, the power of Vishnu preserves the world. | |

They see the world as a beautiful place that should be cared for and valued. • God the Creator cares for the creation, including human beings. • As human beings are part of God’s good creation, they do best when they listen to God. • The Bible shows that God <i>wants</i> to help people to be close to him — he keeps his relationship with them, gives them guidelines on good ways to live (such as the Ten Commandments). |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> For Christians, there are stories in the Old and New Testament which reveal the power of God over nature and the world In the Old Testament, the story of God parting the sea for Moses to pass through, saving them from the Pharoah is an example In the New Testament, the story of Jesus calming the water on the lake is an example of his power over nature Muslims express their belief in the power of Allah through the 99 names – eg | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The story about the birth of Jesus is found in two of the four gospels – Matthew and Luke It is not in the other two gospels of Mark and John at all The two stories have similarities, such as Jesus is born in Bethlehem and the family make their home in Nazareth The two stories have differences, such as the shepherds in Luke and the wise men in Matthew This is because each of the gospel writers interpreted the story of Jesus in a way | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Muslims believe the prophet Muhammad (pbuh) was visited by the angel Gabriel (or Jibril) near Mecca over 1400 years ago. The angel gave him messages from Allah that formed the basis of the Qur'an. The book is kept on a high shelf above other books, and people wash their hands before touching it to show their respect for the word of Allah. 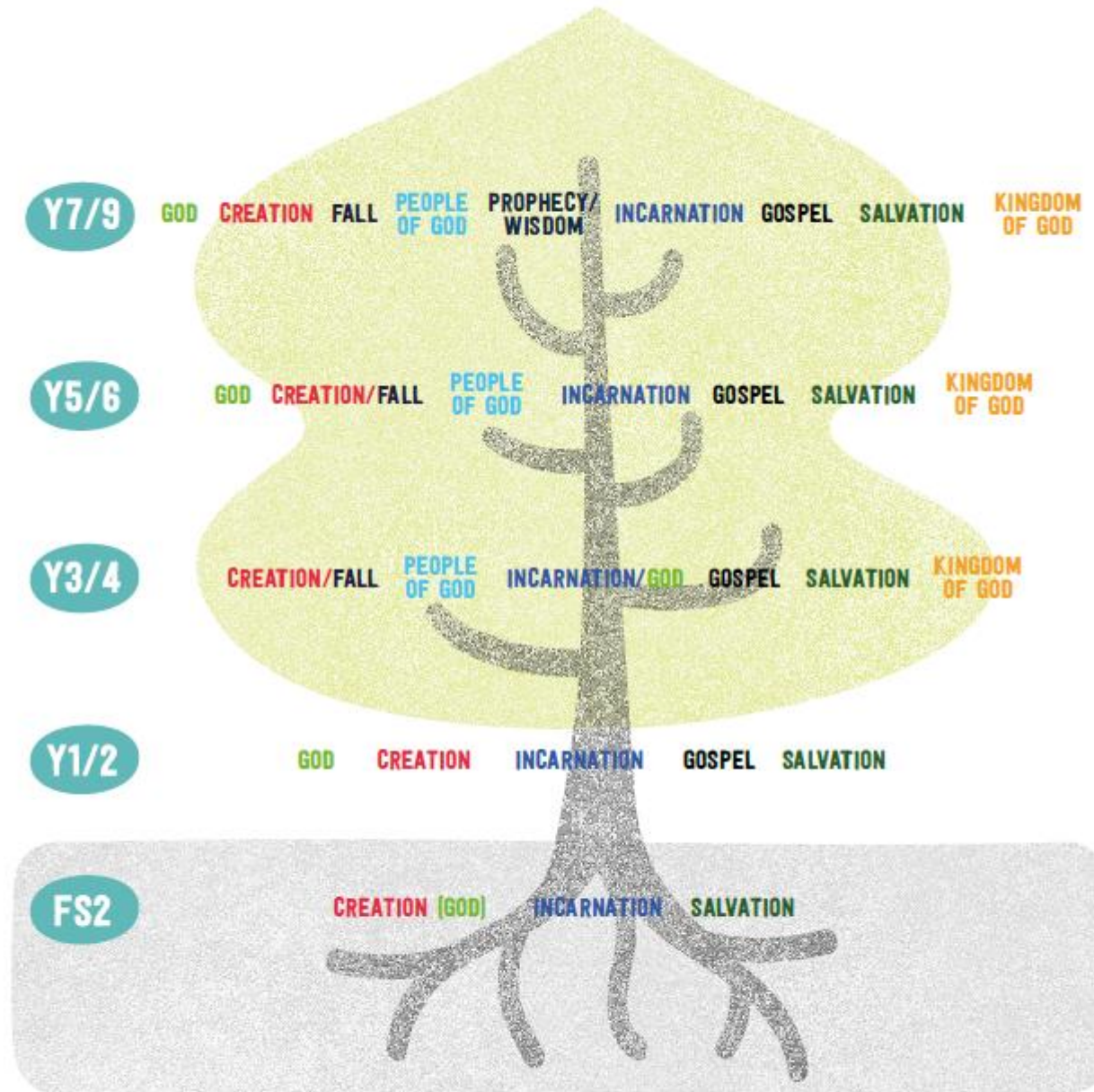

| <p>the Mighty, the Forceful One, the All Powerful</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Qur'an also confirms the power of Allah – 5:12 “Allah has power over everything” • Many humanists believe that we should live a good life: which mean ‘lives worth living, fruitful and flourishing lives, lives that have a positive impact on others’ • Jesus told many parables about the Kingdom of God. These suggest that God’s rule has begun, through the life, teaching and example of Jesus, and subsequently through the lives of Christians who live in obedience to God. • The Kingdom is compared to a feast where all are invited to join in. Not everyone chooses to do so. • Many Christians try to extend the Kingdom of God by challenging unjust social structures in their locality and in the world. | <p>that highlighted what was important to them as a writer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jesus was Jewish • Christians believe Jesus is God in the flesh • They believe that his birth, life, death and resurrection were part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God • The old testament talks about a ‘rescuer’ or ‘anointed one’- a messiah. Some texts talk about what this Messiah would be like • Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled these expectations, and that he is the Messiah (Jewish people do not think Jesus is the Messiah) • Christians see Jesus as their Saviour | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The New Testament has the four gospels which tell the stories about Jesus • Christians believe it contains the words of God, providing guidance and wisdom about how to live your life • Christians believe the good news is not just about setting an example for good behaviour and challenging bad behaviour: it is that Jesus offers a way to heal the damage done by human sin • Christians see that Jesus’ teachings and example cut across expectations- the Sermon on the Mount is an example of this, where Jesus’ values favour the weak and vulnerable, not making people comfortable • Christians believe that Jesus’ good news transforms lives now, but also points towards a restored, transformed life in the future • Christians believe that they should bring this good news to life in the world in different ways, within their church family, in their personal lives, with their neighbours, in the local, national and global community | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Hajj is a devotion to Allah and is a key rite of passage for a Muslim | <p>People of God. As their circumstances change they have to learn new ways to follow God</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The story of Moses and the Exodus shows how God rescued his people from slavery in Egypt: Christians see this story as looking forward to how Jesus’ death and resurrection also rescue people from slavery to sin • Christians apply this idea to living today by trying to serve God and to bring freedom to others. For example by loving others, caring for them, bringing health, food, justice and telling the story of Jesus • Christians see the Christian Church as part of the ongoing story of the People of God, and try to live in a way that attracts others to God, for example as salt and light in the world | |
